Every year, as we gear up and start our Religious Education Program - for the children as well as our RCIA class - I am reminded of how important it is for us to know our catechism. It can be such a help to our spiritual lives and our life of prayer. It's a tragedy that nowadays a vast number of Catholics do not know their Faith. Many Catholics have fallen away because they did not know their Faith and could not appreciate the treasure they had.

Do we know the tenets of our Faith well enough? Would we be able to give a reasoned explanation (Apologetics) of our Faith and Creed?

Here are some helpful apologetics resources:

-Beginning Apologetics (by Fr. Chacon and J. Burham, it costs about \$60 total)
