Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

I would like to give you an overdue update on the various projects we have around the church.

Back Field: After a lengthy search for the right contractor & pavilion design, we applied for permits in early February. Our permit was approved this month.

Main Church A/C: Short-term repairs were made to a dying air conditioner last summer, and a new 30-ton HVAC unit was ordered in October! The new unit is being installed. Unforeseen additional work is necessary at this stage. We'll hopefully be cooling soon.

Parking Lot/Driveway: We are aware of the deterioration of the parking lot in certain places. We are working with our contractors to rectify the underlying issues. Once these concerns are addressed, we can make repairs and restripe the lot.

St. Scholastica Chapel: Having ascertained that the leak was successfully repaired and that any major renovations are still only on the horizon, we made the small repairs necessary to give the chapel a more polished and prayerful atmosphere.

Sanctuary Lamp: While we weren't expecting our old lamp to fail as it did, a new sanctuary lamp fixture was purchased several months ago. The existing counterbalance was insufficient for its weight, so we ordered a new counterbalance and discovered they are made to order and there is a six month lead time. Once this arrives, we will hire professionals to hang our new fixture securely; until then, we will make due.

Thank you for your continuing generosity which allows us to accomplish all of this. Please know that you and your families are in my prayers, especially at the Altar of Our Lord.
